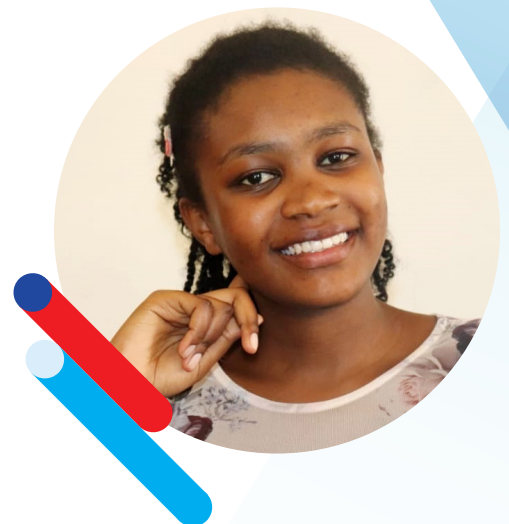

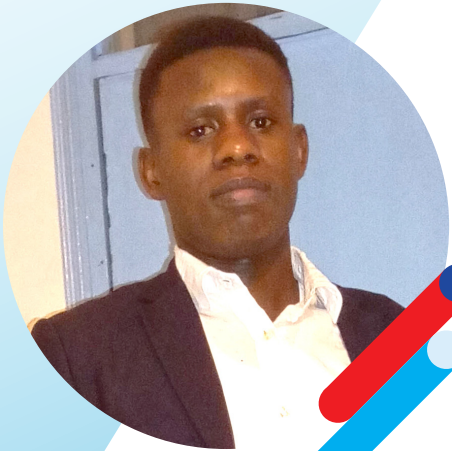

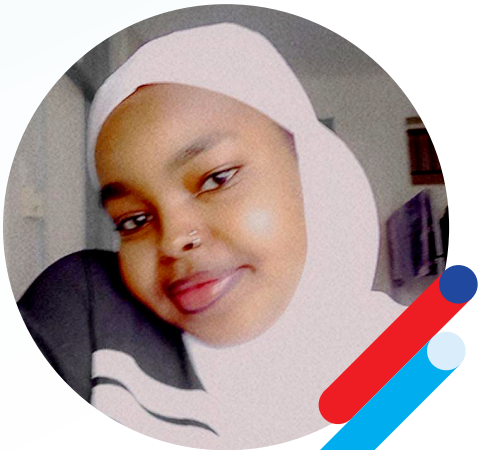

Embracing Competency-Based Education

The education landscape in Kenya has undergone a remarkable transformation with the introduction of the Competency-Based Education (CBE) system, which replaced the long-standing 8-4-4 system in 2017. This shift marks a major milestone in Kenya's commitment to equipping learners with practical skills, values, and competencies that meet the demands of the 21st century.

As we celebrate this year's graduation, we also celebrate the progress made under CBE. The first cohort of learners will be advancing to Senior Secondary (Grade 10) come January 2026, marking a significant step in the full implementation of the new system. With the first group expected to join universities in 2029, our institution has already positioned itself at the forefront of this educational transformation.

At our university, we recognize that preparing for the future requires proactive planning and innovation. The Bachelor of Education curriculum has been revised and aligned to meet the goals and philosophy of the Competency-Based Education framework. This updated curriculum has been approved by the Commission for University Education (CUE), affirming our readiness to train future educators who are competent, creative, and responsive to the evolving needs of society.



We are committed and confident in our ability to prepare future educators who are skilled, innovative, and adaptable to the changing needs of society.



To ensure effective implementation, the university has invested in capacity building for faculty members. So far, we have conducted two comprehensive CBE training sessions for lecturers across the University. These sessions focused on developing key skills such as learner-centered instruction, performance-based assessment, and integration of digital learning tools all critical for delivering CBE effectively.

Moreover, as part of our commitment to excellence, every Education student undergoes CBE training before graduation. This initiative ensures that our graduates are not only theoretically prepared but also practically equipped to thrive in classrooms guided by the new curriculum.

As the nation transitions fully into CBE, our university remains steadfast in its mission to nurture teachers who will inspire a new generation of learners, individuals who can think critically, solve problems creatively, and contribute meaningfully to the world around them.

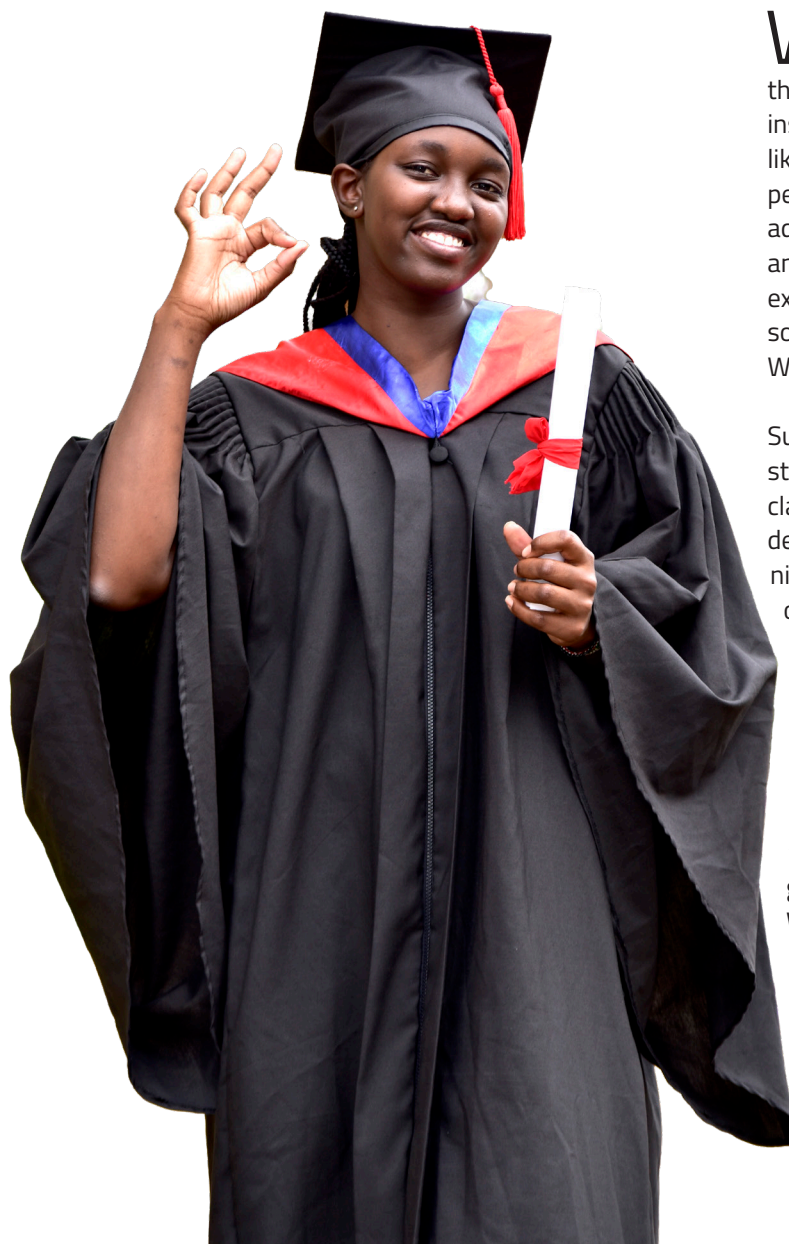
